

Overview

Feel Good Field Trips: Connecting children to new opportunities

Feel Good Field Trips was developed by Avanti West Coast as part of their mission to make rail travel accessible to school children across the UK. This initiative aimed to provide free train trips to school groups, empowering students aged 4 to 18 to explore new experiences and destinations. Rooted in the Avanti Schools Programme, Feel Good Field Trips strived to bridge gaps for young people from diverse socio-economic backgrounds, enabling them to connect with cultural, educational, and recreational opportunities across the West Coast Main Line (WCML).

By offering free end-to-end experiences and removing financial and logistical barriers, the trips promoted equal access to travel and discovery, offering schools the chance to integrate enriching trips into their students' learning journeys. The programme aspired to inspire curiosity, confidence, and an understanding of rail safety, setting the stage for children to embrace future opportunities.

> Since its inception in January 2023, Feel Good Field Trips has made a significant impact:

5,250 students

have participated, accompanied by 802 staff members, creating countless memories.



215 trips

have taken place at 60 unique venues across the UK, ensuring a variety of learning experiences.

> Students and staff have collectively taken 450 Avanti West Coast train journeys, traveling over 50,000 miles

along the WCML, including travelling across other TOCs.



These figures underscore the initiative's success in delivering meaningful, educational, and enjoyable experiences to students, often reaching those who may not have had such opportunities otherwise.

What was included in a Feel Good Field Trip?

Every Feel Good Field Trip was thoughtfully designed to ensure both safety and enjoyment for students and staff.



George the Poet hosted pupils from Ashbury Meadow Primary School, Manchester on the first Feel Good Field Trip with a once-in-a-lifetime poetry writing and recording studio production workshop in a London recording studio. Ten pupils aged 10-11 collaborated with George onboard an Avanti West Coast train from Manchester Piccadilly to London Euston in a poetry workshop, which saw them create their very own piece of spoken word art.

The experience included:

- Rail Safety Talk: Students learned essential safety tips for lifelong awareness
- Free travel on an Avanti Train: Reserved seating ensured a seamless journey, making the train ride part of the adventure
- Lunch: Complimentary meals for students and staff added convenience
- Unique Destinations: Trips included exciting activities or visits to cultural and educational landmarks along the West Coast Mainline
- Activity Pack: Participants received a Feel Good Field Trip booklet, a pen, and a copy of Arlo's Adventures, reinforcing rail safety messages

Feel Good Field Trips reflected Avanti West Coast's commitment to inclusivity, curiosity, and opportunity, enriching education and building confidence. This initiative exemplified corporate responsibility, unlocking new experiences and inspiring future generations.

Next steps

Railway 200

This year marks the 200th anniversary of the modern railway, celebrating its transformative impact on Britain and the world. Railway 200 is a year-long campaign starting in January 2025, honouring the past, present, and future of rail. It invites communities, rail organizations, and others to participate in events highlighting rail's history, sustainability, and societal role.

Railway 200 also emphasizes the importance of education and engagement. School trips and school engagement programs are a key focus, providing students with hands-on experiences that inspire curiosity and spark interest in rail careers. The campaign includes a nine-month festival showcasing international projects and significant upgrades like HS2 and East West Rail.

It will promote skill development, innovation, heritage, and the contributions of railway workers. Key activities include the Railway 200 exhibition train, community events, and commemorative merchandise across the UK. It aims to inspire future generations, attracting volunteers and talent to the rail industry.
